In the 1500s...

Bread was divided according to status. Workers got the burnt bottom of the loaf, the family got the middle, and guests got the top, or "upper crust".





Houses had thatched roofs (thick straw, piled high, with no wood underneath). It was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the pets (dogs, cats and other small animals, mice, rats, bugs lived in the roof). When it rained, it became slippery and sometimes, the animals would

slip and fall off the roof. Hence the saying, "It's raining cats and dogs".
