We teach, in group riding, to ride to the level of the LEAST experienced rider. How many chapters have members with only a year or less of group riding experience? Do we become complacent? Are we using acronyms too much? Do

we explain what they mean when we use them? Do we know what they all mean, or do we occasionally "parrot" them? When you were a new member, did someone explain all this to you, or did they assume you knew what Level I meant, or what a staggered formation was? I know when we were new to GWRRA, there was little information passed on to us concerning some of the things mentioned above. We tried to watch and learn from others, so as to what they were doing, and follow along as best we could. This, of course, can be a dangerous approach to use. Not knowing

what a particular term, or statement means, could easily lead to disaster. We must always be aware that as Rider Educators, we must communicate to get the "education" part across to others. If we get set in our ways, get complacent and overlook the fact that not everyone knows what we mean, we are not doing our job as Educators. For example, I always "sign off" my emails or newsletter articles with "R.S.H.F.". Many of you know what that means. Many of you do NOT know what that means. So, just for the record, it means "Ride Safe Have Fun"



We all need to do our position properly. If you need help in writing articles for the Chapter Newsletter, or in getting seminars, or giving Chapter talks or seeking information to any part of Rider Education, contact the District Educator Staff. We will be delighted to help in any way we can. You can use information from many places, but remember to give credit to those when you use their information. Be careful about "copy write" material. It is important to know how to give a Chapter talk, but it is just as important to be prepared to do so.

And as always, always be watchful for the unwatchful RSHF.



Newsletters Can Catch the Interest of Your Membership

Because we are not able to visit all the Chapters as much as we would like, Chapter newsletters are a vital link to help us know what is going on. A recent survey by the Home Office in Phoenix revealed that Chapter members list the Chapter newsletter as something they look forward to the most in GWRRA. Unfortunately, some Chapters are not publishing any kind of a newsletter.

Publishing a newsletter is one of the very few things that a Chapter is requested to do. It does not have to be an elaborate work of art, but only a couple of pages to keep your members abreast of things going on in your Chapter and around the Region. In fact, some Chapters only have one page of their Chapter news and sends that with a copy of the District newsletter to their members.

Let me encourage you to send a monthly newsletter to your regularly attending members and then, once a quarter, randomly send your newsletter to other members in your area that do not attend. This just may prick the interest of people in your area and they may just surprise you by attending your meeting just to see who you are and what you are doing. Just think about it, new members coming to see what is going on, they like what they find, they become regular attendees, the Chapter gets "new blood" with new ideas, the Chapter gets more active and grows, old members keep up with what is going on around the state and become more active, and start having more fun; all because of a newsletter. Who knows? Yours could be the next "most active Chapter" in Region A.
