We have also spoken with and signed a contract with Hampton Inn as our Co-Host Hotel. This site is located directly down the hill and across the street from the Holiday Inn Skytop. It has just undergone a \$300,000 renovation with new furniture, flooring, and mattresses....we actually saw all of it being hauled in). You will not need a registration number for this site. The cost per room is \$75 for doubles and kings or \$85 for a king suite and a continental breakfast is included. To book a room here, use the Group Code GWRRA and speak to Amanda.

ERC'S vs PLP'S

Well, the summer riding season is in full swing and I trust everyone is making the most

of it. Even with the afternoon thunder storms, the weather has been pretty darn good. So, what can we do to make the riding even more enjoyable?



The question of ERC's versus PLP's comes up occasionally. This year, at Wing Ding in Ft. Wayne, Indiana, I took the new Experienced Rider Course (ERC) It is different than in the past. To begin with, it is 5-6 hours outdoors on the riding range. No 4 hours of classroom instruction and I consider that a plus. The classroom instruction of the past,

was educational and the information was, for the most part, interesting. But not 4 hours worth of interesting. The new ERC stresses techniques and the han-



dling of your motorcycle. AND, the new exercises are really good. There were a couple of exercises, that make you work to accomplish them! There was one exercise, that after the class ran it 3-4 times, I asked if I could run it a few more times, as did several other riders. I never accomplished the exercise to my satisfaction. I believe that exercise and perhaps one other, may be out of the expertise of a novice rider. So, where does this lead?

Well, a Parking Lot Program (PLP) exercise should not be considered as a total replacement of an ERC, given by Certified MSF In-



structors. The PLP is a good exercise to refresh you riding skills. Many of the riding exercises in the PLP handbook, are the same as some in the ERC program. The Slow Ride, Quick Stop, Stopping on a Curve, Straight Weave, Off-Set Weave and

one or two of the turning exercises as examples. As I said, these exercises are to refresh and practice your riding skills. A novice rider can learn some skills from a PLP, but please remember, taking a PLP does NOT make you an experienced rider. As long as National Rider Ed allows Georgia to use a PLP in lieu of an ERC to take part in the Rider Ed Level Programs (Level 1-4, including renewals), I suggest we take advantage of it as long as we can. I also suggest that we take advantage of the Basic and ERC programs offered by the Georgia State MSF office. As for the Rider



Ed Program qualifications, both the PLP and the ERC courses are good for 3 years. Everyone should take a PLP at least once a year and everyone should take an ERC

course at least once during their rider career, the sooner the better. Both will help you, so take advantage of them

And as always, always be watchful for the unwatchful




Just in case you have forgotten, the Region A Couple Of
