THE RIDING SEASON IS UNDERWAY AND

You will be riding with friends, and in some cases alone. An article I read, written by the Chapter Educator, Gene Krattli of Chapter X, in Macon, touched upon a subject that perhaps a lot of us are guilty of. I thought this may be a good time to jog your awareness to a possible problem.

And that would be, "Target Fixation" or "Road Hypnosis". Following behind someone for a period of time can be taxing to your alertness. All you see is the bike (or car/truck) in front of you, and not much more. You see the same thing on Interstates, as drivers doze off for whatever reason; and some serious accidents do occur. Target fixation or road hypnosis can be beat by doing what every riding instructor or seminar presenter constantly says, "Keep your head and eyes MOVING!" Up and down, side to side, always looking for potential hazards, wildlife, and all the other things we encounter while on the road. You can move your eyes side to side within the limits of your helmet and move the whole head from time to time just to ease the load on the head from the helmet. If riding 2up, have your Co-rider do the same thing. You usually know when your Co-rider dozes off. The "clunk" of their helmet hitting your helmet is usually a give away that they are napping. If you both are moving your head and eyes, constantly, you have twice the opportunity to observe and take corrective action if any hazard should appear.

As this Chapter Educator stated: "Stay alert, and use common sense so that you can ride again another day!" And as always, always be watchful for the unwatchful
