#### **Cold Weather Reminders...**

Dressing properly for cold weather was discussed recently. The weather has certainly been cold enough that I hope everyone is taking the proper precautions to stay warm. And, as you are all aware, dressing properly for the cold is just as important off the Wing as well as on it.

Just remember to "layer" your clothing. If you haven't tried it, do so; you will notice the difference. Know and recognize the signs and symptoms of frost bite. Frost bite, you say? Well, if you haven't protected your face and hands, and you are riding in 25-35 degree weather, once you figure out the wind chill factor, frost bite becomes a reality.

Air pressure also becomes a problem. Cold weather does have an effect on tire pressure. Make sure you check your tires every time you ride. This is, of course, an important item in any weather; but as a reminder, check your tire pressure.

Spring is somewhere out there! And, it will eventually arrive. So, in the meantime, throw another log on the fire and enjoy the moment. You might even go out and start the Wing and let it warm up some also.

#### ARE WE REALLY DYING TO BE SEEN?

"BEING SEEN" is a topic I wrote about a few months ago; but, because of its importance, this topic warrants to be repeated. And, since repetition is an effective tool to help us learn, I hope it will be effective in conveying principles of Motorist Awareness.

Policemen at accidents where motorcycles were involved were not surprised to hear the motorist who caused the accident say: "But officer, I didn't see him". So what do we do to ensure we are seen?

We don ourselves with colorful riding apparel, we install bells and whistles, we cover our bikes with more and more lights, lighting it up like a Christmas tree. With all these additions, you would think motorists would have no difficulty seeing us. But, this is still not enough.

As part of our Rider Education program, we educated ourselves on safe riding practices and techniques. We participate in Parking Lot Practices, ERCs, ARCs, Road Captain Courses, and CPR & First Aid training. These are all effective methods of preparing ourselves. But, we still haven't addressed the issue of "being seen" by the four, six and eighteen wheel motorists that we share the road with.

We have talked the talk, now let's walk the walk. We must inform and educate motorists that motorcycles are on the roads, and increasing in numbers daily. We must make an effort to hand out awareness material at events and motorcycle shows, and to speak in one on one conversations with friends and neighbors. We must do our part to raise the awareness of motorists to be cognizant of the fact that motorcyclists are everywhere and that their recognition of this fact could prevent injury and/or loss of life. Hopefully, in the future we will not hear someone say: "I DIDN'T SEE HIM."

# Every Chapter Can Use A Membership Enhancement Coordinator

Throughout our District, several new Chapter Directors are in place as we begin 2009. At Chilly Willy, Donna and I were unable to get around and meet all of the new CDs; so at this time, we would like to extend our congratulations to all. This is going to be an exciting year as they explore new ideas and techniques to bring the fun into your Chapter Gatherings.

A Chapter Director does not and should not have to go it alone. Having a staff to assist with key duties is essential to maintain efficient operation of a Chapter. One position that Donna and I encourage every Chapter Director to fill is that of Membership Enhancement Coordinator (MEC). It is an extremely important and fun position; one that will assist the Chapter Director in many ways. A MEC can be instrumental in helping the CD keep gatherings fun, keeping members involved, and letting members know that they are important.

A MEC can be responsible for the Chapter sign-in sheet at each Chapter Gathering. Doing so will allow them the time to talk to each participant and guest. This task affords the MEC an opportunity to keep watch on the membership expiration dates. The MEC should pay particular attention to all new visitors, never allowing them to sit alone. Encourage other chapter members to sit with them; helping visitors to feel welcome and understand aspects of the gathering; such as ticket sales.

Another important MEC task could be to call participants who miss a gathering, letting them know they were missed. The MEC could also be responsible for calling members on the 'New Members' and 'Expiring and Expired Members' lists that Donna and I distribute each month to every Chapter Director; encouraging members to attend Chapter gatherings and events. Still another potential MEC task could be to fill out an information sheet on the new participants, ensuring needed information is collected to add them to the chapter roster, calling tree, birthday list, etc.

It is up to each Chapter Director to "adjust" the specifics of the tasks they assign to their MEC. But, as you can see, there are plenty of tasks that a MEC can be responsible for.
