RIDE AWARE!

"Ride Aware!" is the Motorist Awareness Division's campaign to reduce the number of crashes, conflict situations and close calls arising between motorcycles, trikes and other roadway users in our evolving, modern highway environment. The Division's two-fold mission is to: (1) Provide information to motorcyclists on means to reduce conflict with other roadway users and the environment in which they ride, and, (2) To inform motorists of means to reduce crashes, near misses and conflicts with motorcyclists.

<u>Motorcyclists:</u> A weak economy and uncertain gas prices have led to an increase of motorcycles of all makes and sizes on the road. Today's motorcyclist is reflective of the general population; and may be a teacher, welder, secretary, doctor, and etc. Many of these motorcyclists are new riders that have little or no training. Additionally, many of these new riders can be seen on small scooters. In many States, the requirements and qualifications required to legally ride these scooters are not as demanding as those of a State driving endorsement required for larger motorcycles. These factors contribute to an increased need for awareness training within the community of motorcyclists.

<u>Motorists:</u> Motorcycles are smaller than cars and trucks and are therefore harder to see. Even if seen, the human brain often times does not register a motorcycle as a threat. Often times, collisions occur when motorists fail to identify motorcycles as a danger. Continued effort must be made to make motorists more aware of motorcycles on the roadways

The Gold Wing Road Riders Association is committed to do its part to reduce the number of collisions involving motorcycles and other vehicles. As an association, we provide materials for training and education. We encourage riding courses with class room participation in an effort to help ensure a safe ride. Through our Motorist Awareness Division, we are also making efforts to train motorists. With our help, motorists can learn not to just see motorcycles, but to mentally associate the sight of a motorcycle with the need for safe following and stopping distances.

Georgia's Governor has proclaimed May as Motorist Awareness Month. Each May, GWRRA Motorist Awareness Coordinators spearhead Motorist Awareness initiatives throughout the association. Give some thought to how you can help. Remember, "We Are Dying To Be Seen!"

Safety Checks

The T-CLOCS system will help each of us to remember the things we need to check before hitting the road. It is way to often that we get on the road without even taking time to check the air in the tires, much less the fluid levels or the brake & clutch levers thoroughly just to mention a few. When you ride your motorcycle you are betting you and your Co-Riders life that every safety feature on it is in perfect working order. If you do not inspect it before each ride, you are decreasing the chance that you will return home safely. Think about this... When riding in a group and something on a bike fails such as the brakes, clutch, tires, etc. and the rider happens to loose control, they are not the only ones affected. Each rider in the group is placed in harms way. I know that a brand new tire can blow out and yes things will happen, but that does not release us from the responsibility of trying our best to prevent them. Please ride safely for your sake and others.
