

From your District Motorist Awareness Coordinators Dave & Betty Andrade

Why Didn't I See That Motorcycle? / Why Didn't That Driver See Me?

Motorcyclists should not assume that they are visible to a driver, even in broad daylight. The fact is: Most motorcycle crashes occur during daylight hours; so, how can you become more visible?

<u>Clothing:</u> As a motorcyclist, you can help to make your presence known to the driver. Select and wear an appropriate helmet with retro-reflective materials. Wear bright, contrasting, protective clothing. If you choose darker clothing, wear a fluorescent vest.

<u>Lane Position</u>: Proper lane position is also important to help you be seen; and for protecting your riding space. Remember, if you can't see the driver in the side-view mirror, the driver can't see you. Don't "hide" in the driver's blind spot! There is no one absolute safe place to ride on the road; but, you can improve your visibility by adjusting your position in a lane when appropriate.

<u>Communication</u>: Don't assume that a driver will know what you intend to do. Clearly communicate your intentions by signaling appropriately for <u>all</u> turns and lane changes. Proper use of your turn signals will help drivers know your intentions.

<u>Motorist Awareness</u>: Remember, drivers tend to look for other cars, not motorcycles. Because of its smaller profile, a motorcycle is harder to see, and the car drivers may find it more difficult to estimate the motorcycle's speed. Traffic, weather, and road conditions also require a motorcyclist to react differently than a driver; thus, it is more difficult for the driver to judge and predict cues that may require the motorcyclist to take evasive action. Again, we can help by promoting motorist awareness. The tone of this article may echo a safety seminar and perhaps it should. We as motorcyclist have the tools to help educate the motorist. By promoting Motorist Awareness, hopefully the remark "honestly officer, I didn't see him" will become a thing of the past.

<u>Rider Education Shines at Wing Fling</u>

Wow, what a time we had at the Georgia Wing Fling!! Vicky and I had the opportunity to see the Rally from a much different perspective than ever before, as District Educators. We were very busy carrying out the duties of our position; however, we had the opportunity to meet several new friends, as well as chat with some old friends. There were several members who stepped in and helped Vicky and I at the Bike Shows (Lighted and Judged), Rider Ed Table, the Sunset Ride and at other times during the rally. Your help was greatly appreciated; THANK YOU for your time, effort and support.

We are very excited about the number of participants who attended the Rider Ed Seminars. We had 16 members attend the Co-Rider Seminar and 19 members attend the Medic First Aid Course. There were 36 applications received at the Rider Ed table for Level I of the Rider Ed Program. I'm not really sure but this may have broken some kind of record. In any event, we are sure happy that more GWRRA Members are committing to RIDE SAFE! It is the start of a foundation to build upon through Rider Education, for a lifetime of safe and enjoyable riding.

If you were unable to participate in the Sunset Ride on Thursday evening at the Georgia Wing Fling, you missed out. Jack & June Gottlieb, of Chapter J (Hiawassee), were very instrumental in setting up this ride. There were 32 motorcycles that were escorted by Chris Clinton (Towns County Sheriff) on a scenic ride through the back roads of Towns and neighboring counties. His Deputies blocked the intersections for us to ride through non-stop, from start to finish. The timing was perfect; the sun was setting over the mountains behind the beautiful landscapes, the temperature was just right and Sheriff Clinton could not have set a better pace for the ride. We would like to say thank-you to Sheriff Clinton and his Deputies for a job well done.

There is a little bit of special information about this escort team that I would like to share with you: Sheriff Clinton and his Deputies were a little late to escort the ride, as there was a little confusion in the scheduling. When Sheriff Clinton's office was contacted to schedule the ride, the person taking the information marked Saturday instead of Thursday night for the ride. This being the case, on Thursday evening approaching time for the ride to begin, there was no one there to escort the ride. June Gottlieb called the Sheriff's office. The sheriff was contacted by radio and he immediately returned June's call. Sheriff Clinton apologized for the mix-up and advised June that he would arrive within fifteen minutes to guide the ride. Sheriff Clinton advised me upon his arrival that he and his Deputies were at a funeral home paying there respects to a fellow Deputy's family member that had past, whom also was a long-time friend of the Sheriff and Deputies. This says a lot for these men. At that time, the Sheriff could have canceled due to the incorrect date and it being bad timing, but he didn't. He stood true to his job and his commitment to serve and I have to admire a person that will do that. My hat is off to Sheriff Chris Clinton and his Deputies. Thanks again to all of you for being a part of the Georgia Wing Fling and for making it such a success this year!
