ASLEEP AT THE WHEEL

All of the beautiful, magnificent days that we have been experiencing lately make us hope that you have had an opportunity to get out and ride. Ah, enjoying the fresh clean air, comfortable temperatures, plentiful sunshine and virtually cloudless skies. Since it seems we are only allotted a handful of these perfect days to enjoy each year, it would be a pity to squander any of them!

Now I don't know about you, but we seem to have an angel on one shoulder and a devil on the other. The angel invites us to take advantage of the fantastic weather, but the devil reminds of us of all the sinister hazards that lurk within our realm. Fear is never a healthy feeling especially when heading out on a bike or trike! Now respect, on the other hand, is healthy! We can blend respect of perceived hazards with caution and utilization of all of our safety training to manage the risk associated with our sport. This allows us to enjoy the ride and return home safely. Returning home safely is always goal number one.

The statements, made by us, are our own editorial take on current events and are the sole responsibility of; well us. Yes, this has become a reccurring theme, but we honestly believe it is this type of safety concern that is our fastest growing and potentially lethal threat. With that in mind...... Georgia, we are here to tell you that it is beyond the point of ludicrous out there, people have taken the current situation to places we never imagined. Let's just list some of the experiences we have had and see what your take is:

- ⇒ Our vehicle is 1st in a left turn lane, left arrow appears, the vehicle behind us cuts inside (to our left) passing in the turn to end up in front of us happened twice so far
- ⇒ A long line of vehicles stopped at a red light, truck creeps up in the right turn lane and when the light turns green, blast across the intersection cutting in front of everyone, only to turn into a subdivision two blocks later
- ⇒ A vehicle exiting a day care center, cuts in front of us to the point we have to slam on our brakes to avoid slamming into the side of their vehicle. We blow the horn, they blow their horn and flip us off

- as if it was our fault

WHY LEADERSHIP TRAINING

We were the first to balk at taking leadership courses, mainly due to being "trained to death" on our jobs for many years. We had had all the courses offered in GWRRA's training program in one form or the other in the past. We had even taught some. However, we went and we enjoyed, and we learned new things. Some things we had forgotten, some things had changed over the years. The main thing is that we had fun, learned, got encouragement and gained different perspectives on the chapter functions. We think training makes better leaders and in this case better chapter leaders and participants.

Pam recently read an article from the *Allbusiness Network* that gives 10 good reasons why you should take a leadershiptraining course. The article stated that leadership courses "can help you improve your leadership skills, and to thereby help you to change your organization from **good to great**." Isn't that what we all want for our chapters?

Whether you are a participant or a team member, you can benefit from taking leadership-training courses. We are all leaders of something. We lead our families, we may lead at work, and we take the lead in planning rallies, fun days, door prize give-a-ways, and lots of other chapter activities. As chapter participants, we interact with the other participants in our chapter and others. Wouldn't you like to know how to effectively do this? Learn or refresh valuable skills? Gain insight into what others in leadership are doing? These 10 reasons for leadershiptraining can be applied to the GWRRA leadership training courses and as a past participant in the program and as University Trainers, we encourage you to read this and enroll for courses in the future. They are FUN! And you learn a lot! We are not too old to learn and each time we learned something new. So can you!

1)They build selfconfidence and wisdom. Leadership training programs can help teach you the essential skills and techniques you need in order to look at challenges from a different perspective. Doing so can add clarity to a difficult situation, and also promotes wisdom and facilitates selfconfidence.

2)They empower you to succeed. If you think great leaders are born and not made, think again. Leadership training courses and various techniques and examples emphasize the point that with a little hard work we all have it in us to be great leaders.

3)They teach valuable skills. Leadership training courses can teach you the skills you need to lead effective-

ly, including the oftentricky skills needed to persuade and influence people -- even those who are volunteers.

4)They encourage introspection. Before you get started, training courses typically test you to find out where you need development. Only after realizing these areas can you begin to improve your skills. You'll have the opportunity to get to know yourself a little better by exploring your motivation to lead, and to test your level of selfconfidence, your emotional intelligence, and other qualities that are needed to become a good leader.

5)They surround you with other leaders. Leadership training programs allow you to study how leadership ideas have emerged and changed over time, helping you make sense of the often-conflicting ideas about leadership that cause so much confusion. You'll also get the opportunity to network with other leaders, and to draw on their experiences.

6)They help lead you to the next level. The next level is about progress, and one way to achieve that progress is to add to your skill set.

7)They help you clarify your vision. Successful leaders have a clear, sound vision of where they want to go. Training gives you the

chance to step back from your daily responsibilities, to examine your organization, and to think about how the future may unfold. You'll learn how to communicate your vision in a way that truly motivates the people around you.

ments of motivation and show you how to motivate your team. They also help you discriminate between good and bad sources of power, and between strong and weak methods of influence.

9)They teach you how to build a team. You'll gain insights on how to pick a good team, how to build a team capable of delivering your vision, and how to give orders without coming off as either too weak or too overbearing.

10)They teach you how to avoid mistakes. Training will give you a glimpse at the worst mistakes you can make as a leader.


