Remember you have a variety of bikes, so plan accordingly. Practice riding if it has been a long time since your last ride. Be patient with co-riders who are not used to being such. Check the traffic. Check on passes needed. Overall, we had fun! Don't forget to take the FUN with you! Take time to stop somewhere special


