Why do we sell the red raffle tickets?

First of all this is not written as a criticism of the chapters and its members. We just want to make it clear why we decided to sell the red tickets and not Chapter tickets.

The Georgia District sent out a request to all the chapters back in the fall asking if they wanted to sell the usual "Chapter" tickets. The answer was "no" or we received no answer with the exception of one chapter. Therefore, based on the response, we decided not to print "Chapter" tickets. However, the Georgia District still needed funds for the upcoming 2017 Georgia Wing Fling.

The team decided that since the chapters wanted no "Chapter" tickets to sell, we would print the red raffle tickets to raise money for the District. District Team members were to sell the tickets. When the tickets started being publicized, some chapters volunteered to help sell them so we approached several more to help sell them. We decided to give them 20% for helping. That is \$1 per each book of 5 sold. The red tickets are not the usual "Chapter" tickets. They are to raise money for the Georgia Wing Fling, and we appreciate any help we get from the chapters. Sorry for any confusion this caused.

Wing Fling is very expensive. Affordable facilities are getting scarce. Attendance is down. We don't make money on Wind Down or Chilly Willy or any other way. Wing Fling is it. Without an effort to raise funds through ticket sales, red tickets and other tickets, we will cease to have a Rally. The same goes for Rider Education. They made about a \$100 last year. They cannot operate on so little.

Some fail to realize that we pay for the facility, coffee, electricity hookups, pins, buttons, hanger bars, decorations, copying, snacks and goodies, hotels, postage, first aid supplies, and many other items in order to provide you, the members, a good time at the rally. Our team members work hard and are not paid a penny. They travel to visit their assigned chapters, sometimes overnight, without compensation. We need your support to survive.

We do appreciate the support of those selling the red tickets. We ask for your continued support. We want the chapters to be functional and raise money too. Help us find a way to help the chapters who need funds. Give us your ideas. A change had to be made since most chapters did not want to sell Chapter tickets, and I hope this helps you understand what we did.


Couple of the Year for 2017—Chapter B2 Jeff and Susan Poirier

Motorist Awareness Safety Break Very Successful!





On March 11th and 12th Chapter L conducted their annual I-75 Biker Coffee Break for travelers moving South on I-75 to all destinations, and encouraged as many Bikers as possible headed to "Bike Week" in Daytona Beach, FL, to ride and drive safely. On average, six (6) riders are killed each year at Bike Week while in the Central Florida area. Our mission is to engage drivers, bikers, bus drives and all travelers in general with conversations about using safe driving habits. Our conversations were not just about bikes, but about being a safe driver around all vehicles on the road, while we offered them a hot cup of coffee, a snack or a bottle of water. Our interactions were to address safety on the road, promote courteous driving habits and especially to be on the lookout for motorcyclist. "Basically just asking/reminding them to use plain old common sense while driving." I feel our Rome Chapter L along with Chapter B2 from Douglasville, did this very successfully over the weekend of March 11th and 12th talking to over 1400 travelers. We challenged and encouraged some passengers to count the number of motorcycles they saw while traveling, and to make sure they always pay attention to everyone on the road when they are in the driver's seat., "especially for bikers". "Riding a bike is supposed to be "FUN", one gentleman told me, "but I often feel like a target while riding around four wheelers. We have the same road rights as everyone on the road does he said, however, some four wheelers don't see it this way and therefore, we must constantly be vigilant when riding." He is exactly right, but we as two and three wheel riders must also remember that courtesy goes both ways, both as a rider and as vehicle drivers. We (bikers) should never take liberties not afforded to all travelers on the roads and to always obey traffic laws, not to mention being courteous ourselves. Our message was loud and clear to all as we presented that everyone needs to represent good driver and rider habits on any road. I know e made a difference to some, hopefully to a lot.

2,007 travelers visited the Georgia Welcome Center. We handed out 10's of dozens of snacks, 20 gallons of coffee, 5 gallons hot chocolate, and over 600 bottles of water. We handed out Safety literature, previous Wing World magazines, Emergency Medical info contact folders, and Chapter welcoming/information cards.

Note: Georgia Chapter B2 also did the safety break on March 12th and Georgia Chapter A held a Safety Break on I-75 at the Rest Area North of Macon, Georgia on March 11th. Others plan to do it later.
